Defending state champion Leilehua will have a tough task ahead of them when they kickoff against top seeded Punahou in the First Hawaiian Bank Division I football state championship game, Friday, Dec. 5, 7:30 p.m. The Buffanblu have an arsenal of playmakers on both sides of the ball, including Manti Te`o, Robby Toma, Dalton Hilliard and Cayman Shutter. This is the third championship game appearance for the Mules under fifth year head coach Nolan Tokuda.

This is the second state championship appearance for the Buffanblu, the last being 2005. Punahou's Te`o participated in that 2005 championship game, except he played for the opposition, the Kahuku Red Raiders, as a freshman, tallying one assisted tackle and a kickoff return for six yards.

In the Division II bracket, defending state champion and top seeded Iolani will take on the OIA runner-up Radford in a rematch of the 2005 DII state championship, which Iolani was victorious, 34-20.

Of the four teams playing in this week's championships, Radford traveled the longest route to the finals, first traveling to the Garden Isle to take on #3 Kauai in a rain-soaked win over the Red Raiders, 17-7, then to the Valley Isle defeating #2 Lahainaluna, 33-27.

The DII championship game kicks off at 4:30 p.m.

TE`O ON THE THE BUTKUS AWARD WATCH LIST:

Punahou senior linebacker Manti Te`o is one of 12 finalists for the first-ever high school Butkus Award. The Butkus Award, widely known as the one of the elite individual honors in college football, also honors the best high school and professional linebackers in the nation.

The Butkus Award is selected by a 51-person panel comprised mostly of scouts, coaches and journalists, and coordinated by Hub Arkush of Pro Football Weekly. The winner is expected to be announced the week of Dec. 8.

HMSA KAIMANA KONTEST:

HMSA will conduct the Kaimana Kontest halftime promotion during the DII and DI championship games at Aloha Stadium. A sign-up booth will be located on the main concourse in the south endzone.

The HMSA Kaimana Awards & Scholarship Program is a unique initiative that promotes physical activity at Hawaii high schools, rewards the achievements of student athletes, and helps underwrite training and certification for coaches. Athletics, academics, sportsmanship and community service are key program elements. HMSA sponsors this program in partnership with the HHSAA.

KRAFT SHOP AND SCORE:

Kraft Foods Hawaii in partnership with Times Supermarket will make a presentation at halftime of the Division I championship game to the top point-earning school in the Kraft Shop and Score promotion. The 46 participating schools divide up \$100,000 worth of credit based on percentage of points each school receives through Times' Royal Card program. The credit can be used to purchase much needed uniforms and equipment from Adidas for the schools' athletic programs. This is the 8th year of the program.

HAWAII ALL-STAR FOOTBALL CLASSIC:

The Hawaii Union Builders Foundation will present the Hawaii All-Star Football Classic, Friday, Dec. 12 at Aloha Stadium. The doubleheader features the HUB Senior Bowl Goodwill Classic at 5:00 p.m. and the Hawaii/Polynesia-Mainland Bowl at 8:00 p.m.

The HUB Senior Bowl Goodwill Classic is in its 18th year and features 100 of the top football seniors from the OIA and ILH. The funds raised for this game helps provide scholarships to college-bound athletes.

The inaugural Hawaii/Polynesia-Mainland Bowl pits 40 of the nation's top prep football players against a 49-man Hawaii roster comprised of players from across the state, American Samoa and mainland players with Hawaii ties.

Aiea High School football head coach Wendell Say will head the Hawaii/Polynesia team, while West Springfield High (VA) head coach Bill Renner will lead the mainland team.

Both games will showcase Hawaii's best football athletes to visiting college recruiters. The games will be held in partnership with SportsLink, the producer of the U.S. Army All-American Bowl held annually in January at the Alamodome in San Antonio, Texas.

Tickets purchased before Dec. 12 are \$10.00 for general admission and \$5.00 for students (K-12) and senior citizens (65+). 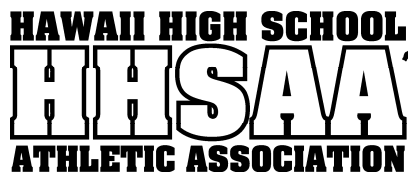
